OPLINEPRIZE was founded in 2009 by Michèle Robine, curator, organiser of cultural events, economist and visual artist.

Over the past 16 years, we have built up a community of leading contemporary and digital artists, all of whom support this event, particularly the international artist ORLAN.

The aim is to create links between major artists with international reputations and established or emerging artists highlighting new technologies.

Leading curators each nominate an artist, and then it's up to Internet users to elect the winner on the Internet.

It's the public that chooses the winner, an act that goes hand in hand with the pleasure of playing while discovering new artists, which facilitates the approach to culture and the sharing of knowledge.

The selection of artists is multidisciplinary, and we present artists of all ages, backgrounds and cultures.

We promote all forms of art, particularly those associated with new technologies, by linking the communities of our guests of honour and young artists.

Having the choice, preferring an artist and expressing it, each year voting among the selected artists is an act of freedom and self-esteem.

Each Internet user becomes the decision-maker and jury for a prize on the net, based on a selection made by prestigious curators.

For the past sixteen years, OPLINEPRIZE has played a major role on the international contemporary art scene by awarding a digital prize that is intergenerational and open to all.

Today, OPLINEPRIZE has four major objectives:

- **To democratise access to contemporary art using digital tools.**

ODILE DECQ

Guest of honour

Odile Decq is a French architect. Her work is a complete universe in which architecture, design, art and urban planning meet, interact and respond to each other. Her direct style and assertive, whimsical personality are matched by her boldly geometric architecture and her innovative creations in every field in which she expresses herself. The architectural achievements of this pioneering and passionate woman include the BPO, the MACRO, the GL Events headquarters, the FRAC Bretagne in Rennes, some highly unusual private homes that she likens to works of art, and her latest project, a residential tower in Barcelona, 'Antares'.



MARGHERITA BALZERANI

Director de Louvre-Lens Vallée

Margherita Balzerani is a curator and art critic specialising in contemporary art related to video games and virtual worlds. She studied art history at the University of Rome La Sapienza and the University of Paris IV Sorbonne. She has worked at the Palais de Tokyo in Paris and directed art festivals linked to virtual reality. She writes about contemporary artists and is a member of the O.M.N.S.H. She is currently director of Louvre-Lens Vallée, a digital centre for cultural start-ups based in the former Paul-Bert school in Lens.



NILS AZIOSMANOFF

Founder of Le Cube - Managing Director of Le Cube Garges

Founding chairman of Le Cube, a digital creation centre opened in 2001. A former jazz musician and director of a music and dance conservatoire, he created the first computer music courses at the Institut National de l'Audiovisuel (INA) and the Institut International de l'Image et du Son (IIS). A winner of the HEC Challenge+, he has helped to set up a number of innovative technology companies in the fields of digital publishing, education and the design of third places. He is in charge of organising ISEA 2023, a major event on the international digital arts scene, with 60 countries taking part. He runs the "Digital creativity and new imaginaries" seminar at Sciences-Po and Institut Mines-Télécom. He hosts Les Rendez-vous du Futur: over 160 programmes dedicated to the challenges of transformation, featuring experts, artists, researchers, philosophers and entrepreneurs. He was one of the "100 personalities of the Next Generation" selected by Les Echos in 2016. He was awarded the Grand Prix 2018 at the "Forum Changer d'Ère" at the Cité des Sciences et de l'Industrie. He is a Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres.



MAURICE BENAYOUN

Visual artist, teacher, founding curator

Maurice Benayoun is a French digital artist, curator and theorist. He lives and works in Paris and Hong Kong. In 1987 he co-founded Z-A, a company and laboratory which for 15 years played a pioneering role in the field of new media, computer-generated images, virtual reality and interactive museography. Maurice Benayoun's work has won numerous awards at international events and has been exhibited in major international museums.

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JEAN-JACQUES GAY

Curator, General Secretary of OPLINE

The man behind synesthésie.com and Spamm.fr, Jean Jacques Gay is director of the accès(s) electronic culture festival (64). Curator, producer, journalist, member of AICA and the CITU team of the Laboratoire Paragraphe/Paris 8. As an exhibition director, JJ Gay accompanies artists and exhibitions that explore emerging electro-digital tools, collaborating with various French and international institutions, endowments and publications such as Artension, Optical Sound, le Fresnoy, l'ADAGP, eTopia and HKcityU.

ALAIN FLEISCHER

Director of Le Fresnoy - Studio national des arts contemporains

Before devoting his life to the invention of images (cinema, photography, installations), Alain Fleischer studied literature, linguistics, semiology and anthropology. His immense body of photographic and cinematographic work has been the subject of several retrospectives in France and abroad. He represented France at the International Biennials in Sydney (Australia), Kwang-ju and Busan (Korea), and Havana (Cuba). He is also the author of some fifty novels, collections of short stories and essays on photography and cinema. After teaching at the Université de Paris III, the Université du Québec à Montréal, and various visual arts and film schools, he was commissioned by the French Ministry of Culture to found Le Fresnoy - Studio national des arts contemporains, which he has directed since 1997.



EMMANUEL MAHÉ

ENSAD Research Director

Emmanuel Mahé, a humanities researcher at EnsAD, specialises in the study of new uses for information and communication technologies, with a particular focus on the fields of exploratory design and digital arts. For the past decade, he has been involved in a range of activities focusing on interactions between the worlds of art and science.

THE CURATORS

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MARIA GRAZIA MATTEI

Founder and President of MEET, the Italian Centre for Digital Culture (Milan)

Maria Grazia Mattei, journalist, art critic and digital evangelist, has been studying digital culture since 1982. In 1995, she founded Mattei Digital Communication, a research centre on new media. In 2005, she launched Meet the Media Guru (MtMG), a platform to promote digital innovation. MtMG has invited over 100 opinion leaders to Italy, including Zygmunt Bauman, Edgar Morin, Manuel Castells and many others. In 2018, with the support of Fondazione Cariplo, it created MEET, the first Italian centre for digital culture. MEET organises meetings, exhibitions and workshops with a humanist perspective on digital innovation. In autumn 2019, MEET will open its building in the heart of Milan.



DOMINIQUE MOULON

Art Critic & Digital Curator

Dominique Moulon is an independent curator, art critic and teacher. He holds a doctorate in Arts and Art Sciences and is a member of the Association française des commissaires d'exposition (CEA), the International Association of Art Critics (AICA) and the Observatoire des mondes numériques en sciences humaines (OMNSH).

Director Centre Wallonie-Bruxelles

Since 2019, Director of the Centre Wallonie-Bruxelles in Paris, whose remit is to help promote contemporary creation and artistic signatures from all the creative expression territories of the Wallonia-Brussels Federation.

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BLANCA PEREZ-FERRER

Head Curator Etopia Centre - Zaragoza

An experienced cultural mediator with a background in art history, who focuses on applying skills to establish, explore and promote new connections between pop culture, new media and traditional arts. Her diverse background and skills enable her to bridge the gap between research and a practical, hands-on approach to artistic projects. She can boast of having planned and coordinated events, organised contemporary art exhibitions, designed and implemented educational initiatives, analysed cultural policies, facilitated intercultural dialogues, managed budgets, raised funds and translated academic research into concrete mediation projects.



ORLAN

International Artist, Founding Curator

ORLAN is an international artist who expresses herself through sculpture, painting, photography and video, as well as installations, performances, biotechnologies and body art. A feminist at heart, ORLAN has been fighting against the violence inflicted on women's bodies and the stereotypes in which society confines them since the 1960s. From 1990 to 1993, the artist took her provocation a step further, using her body as a medium for experimentation and artistic expression. Recognised for her contribution to contemporary art and feminism. She received the Grand Prix de l'e-Réputation 2013, organised by Alexia Guggémos in the visual arts category, which rewards the most popular personalities on the internet, before the Grand Prix International de l'Excellence Féminine in 2017. In 2020, she was awarded the medal of the Ordre National de la Légion d'Honneur and published her autobiography ORLAN STRIP-TEASE: TOUT SUR MA VIE, TOUT SUR MON ART (Editions Gallimard). In 2023, she released her single "Je suis slowsexuel.le".

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QIU ZHIJIE

Artiste, écrivain, curateur. Pékin

Artist and curator, born in Zhangzhou, Fujian Province in 1969, lives in Hangzhou and Beijing. He began his involvement in contemporary art activities after graduating from the Printmaking Department of the Zhejiang Academy of Fine Arts in 1992. He is now the vice president of the Central Academy of Fine Arts in China, a director of the Chinese Artists Association, an invited artist of the Contemporary Art Institute of the China Art Research Institute, and a member of the Experimental Art Committee of the China Artists Association. He is also the curator for The Chinese Pavilion at the 57th Venice Biennale in 2017.

Director of VIDEOFORMES

Artistic director of VIDEOFORMES, international festival of hybrid and digital arts, independent curator, artistic director, video and digital art producer, video artist.

DONATIEN AUBERT

Nominated by Nils ASIOSMANOFF

Donatien Aubert is an artist, researcher and author. He was part of the Spatial Media program, specializing in the creation of virtual reality experiences and shared 3D environments. His hybrid works include videos, interactive installations, virtual reality experiences and sculptures created by computer-aided design and manufacturing. He bases his visual research on treatments that have been reinforced by digital technologies (generativity, interactivity, immersion), mobilizing a visual grammar capable of putting into tension a baroque and romantic aesthetic with more minimal and industrial influences.



CHEN BAORYANG

Nominated by Qiu Zhijie

Chen Baoyang is an artist who alters default technological applications to achieve his artistic goals, exploring the boundaries between us, machines and beyond, in an intermediate perceptual and corporeal space. machines and beyond, in an intermediate perceptual and corporeal space. He works in a variety of media, from painting to video art to installation. video art. A graduate of Columbia University, Chen uses self-coded algorithms to create chaotic surfaces with a certain orderliness, expressing the notion of a "world".orderliness, expressing the notion of the "impossibility of improvisation" in his creative process.



AMÉLIE BOUVIER

Nominated by Stéphanie Pécourt

Her artistic practice is based on historical research in the field of astronomy, and explores issues of cultural memory and collective heritage. Astronomers in particular, and scientists in general, not only explain the world, they also represent it through the construction of diagrams, illustrations, photographs or equations. through the construction of diagrams, illustrations, photographs and equations. She is particularly interested in the sky and the stars as a landscape exposing current socio-political contradictions. Although her work is based on historical facts, data and images, she constantly mixes these with speculative images, adapting tools and techniques to present alternative potentialities.

THE ARTISTS

FAYE FORMISANO

Nominated by Jean-Jacques Gay

Artist-director and researcher, Faye Formisano's work explores the border of identities through fantastic figures. Inspired by science, dance, and literature, she draws from the idea of the monster a principle of metamorphosis that questions the notion of the link between the human and his environment. Combining old and new technologies, his films, drawings, and immersive textile (VR) installations are presented at film festivals in France and internationally, as well as in various art centers and galleries. In 2023, she was nominated for the 3rd Carte Blanche of the cite des Sciences et DE l'industrie.



AGNÈS GUILLAUME

Nominated by Gabriel V SOUCHEYRE

Former musician Agnès Guillaume turned to video art in 2010. She produces videos, mixed works and embroideries. She sees her videos as mirrors reflecting intimacy that also function as poetic forms that reflect self-awareness. On a daily basis, Agnès Guillaume adds embroidery works based on her own sketches and drawings. These pieces are traces of her vision of visible reality.



LYES HAMMADOUCHE

Nominated by Emmanuel MAHE

Artist, researcher and teacher, Lyes Hammadouche's work explores the complexity of consciousness. His works embody contemporary science on delocalized consciousness and self-delusion. At the crossroads of art and design, he creates quasi-functional sculptures glasses and jewelry, using hypnosis as a principle shared with the public. His technical productions, incorporating captological principles, are presented with a playful sense of humor, while taking a critical look at technology and inviting contemplation of otherness and introspection.



THE ARTISTS



JUAN LE PARC

Nominated by Maurice Benayoun

Juan Le Parc has been exploring the representation of the human body for many years, fusing art and science. He constructs artistic universes based on aesthetics of monstrosity, integrating hybrid beings from mythical imaginations and questioning the ideologies surrounding the perfection of the contemporary body. He creates strange multimedia shows, such as Chaosmose and Suspension Cube, exploring bodily and psychic modifications. He frequently collaborates with medical and scientific institutions, exploring the intersections between art and science.



DAPHNÉ LE SERGENT

Nominated by ORLAN

Daphné Le Sergent is a visual artist and theorist. Korean and French, she works on notions of personal identity and deterritorialization, which she approaches through photography, drawing and video. In diptychs, she explores the notion of "schize", or inner division. She is also a lecturer at Paris 8 University and a member of the International Association of Art Critics.



VERA MOLNAR

Nominated by Odile DECQ

After studying at the School of Fine Arts in Budapest and discovering cubism, Vera Molnár went to Rome in 1947 to continue her research on geometric painting, but she soon joined Paris. Impressed by the work of Le Corbusier and Fernand Léger, she aspired to a more radical style. Theoretically, she is influenced by Mondrian, Malevich and the Zurich movement of concrete art. She favours simple geometric elements and seeks to «create works in a conscious way»: her work does not try to remove all traces of subjectivity, but develops through the senses, which are, according to the artist, the very origin of creation. Her first works still belong to the abstract and minimalist current. The titles, always very descriptive, recall her constant quest for objectivity

PAULA NISHIJIMA

Nominated by Blanca Pérez-Ferrer

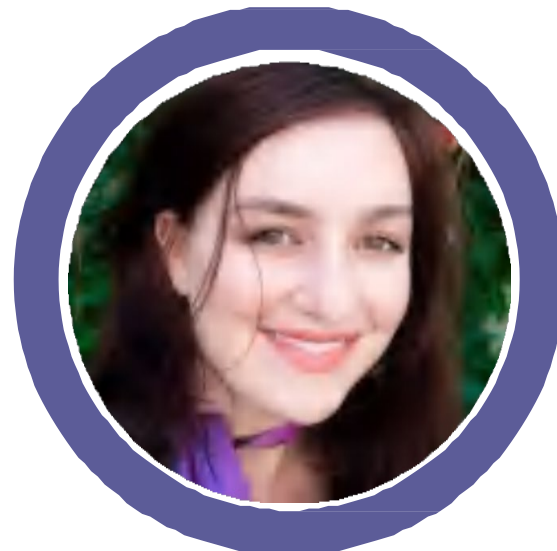
Paula Nishijima is a visual artist whose research practice is based on a transdisciplinary approach. It links scientific disciplines, decolonial theories and non-human cosmologies. His interest is in the collective and self-organized behavior of decentralized living and artificial systems, and how this inspires more collaborative, sustainable and ethical forms of relationships between humans, non-humans and the environment.



CHIARA PASSA

Nominated by Maria-Grazia Mattei

A visual artist working in media art since the second half of the 1990s, Chiara Passa's artistic research analyzes differences in virtual spaces through various techniques, frequently using augmented reality and virtual reality technologies. She works on interactive video installations, digital art in public spaces, video sculpture, projection mapping, artistic applications and widgets for mobile platforms.



CHARLOTTE POUYAUD

Nominated by Alain Fleischer

Director and artist, Charlotte Pouyaud studied philosophy and graduated from the Beaux-Arts de Bordeaux. She produces music videos and video artworks with historical and political themes. She is the artistic director of the Daisy Mortem group, and has notably directed films for the Panorama 24 exhibition at Le Fresnoy. Her first film, Spybird, deals with new technologies and mass surveillance, featuring a half-bird creature. A half-bird, half-drone creature watching over the inhabitants of a city. Charlotte Pouyaud is also founder and singer of the group naughtybabysub.

CAMILLE REIDT

Nominated by Margherita Balzerani

A graduate in applied arts, design and ceramics, Camille Reidt has developed a practice at the crossroads of art and design, collaborating with scientists, artists and industrialists. The motif of plants and the living is very present in her work, enabling her to address the themes of ecosystems and the link between man and his environment. She develops her work in her independent studio, Madame Camille Reidt, in Limoges, and has been exhibited at the MIAM in Sète.



SANTIAGO TORRES

Nominated by Dominique Moulon

Santiago Torres is a multidisciplinary South American artist-programmer based in Paris. His in-depth analysis of programming and interaction since 2007, influenced by video games and the quantum universe and his personal relationship with the pioneers of kinetic and cybernetic art (Julio Le Parc and Atelier Schöer), Torres creates interactive immersive spaces. Santiago Torres' work is part of a perpetual cybernetic evolution, now multidimensional. He develops paintings not only tactile and in three dimensions, but where he succeeds in integrating the 4th dimension, that of the interactive movement, into his works.



WU ZIYANG

Nominated by Chen Wang

Wu Ziyang is an artist based in New York and Hangzhou, currently teaching at the School of Intermedia Art at the China Academy of Art, Visiting Professor at the Expanded Media Department at Alfred University, and a former member of NEW INC at the New Museum.

He holds an MFA from Rhode Island School of Design, and a BFA from the Florence Academy of Fine Arts. His video, AR, AI simulation, and interactive video installation have exhibited internationally.

VÉRONIQUE BATON

Direction – Programming Le Grenier à Sel

Art historian, specialist in Italian art of the late sixteenth century. Independent curator for various institutions including the Domaine départemental du Château d'Avignon (in 2011). Successively Curator at the Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain, at the Collection Lambert of the Musée d'art contemporain in Avignon, Director of the MIAM, Musée international des arts modeste, in Sète and Director of the Visual Arts Pole in Lauris, Vaucluse.



THOMAS CHENESEAU

Academic Director GES Eductive

Thomas Cheneseau continues a work of sharing with the 2.0 artistic communities. It is with his diversions from the social network Facebook that he begins his work by producing series of screenshots (images and videos) and performative activities online. He is the first curator and the launch of the «Spamm» project in 2011, as well as a curator for Trans-numériques in Brussels in 2012. In 2016 the Ministry of Culture commissioned him the artistic direction of the digital art exhibition «Unlike» in Poitiers and he became Public Relations Manager of the art center Le Confort Moderne in 2018.



XIAO GE

Director Phoenix Center

Xiao Ge is an artist and curator. After 14 years in France, she now lives in Beijing. She has curated numerous international exhibitions, both solo and collective. She has also been a member of the jury for numerous art and media awards. In 2014, she joined Phoenix Satellite Television Groupe as co-founder of Phoenix Art. Editor-in-Chief and Vice President of Artifeng and in 2014 Director of the Phoenix Center.

ALEXIA GUGGÉMOS

Director new media observatory

Alexia Guggémos is a journalist and art critic, specializing in art dissemination strategies on social media. She is the creator of the smile museum, the first virtual museum created in 1996. A digital sociologist, she founded the Observatoire du Web social dans les arts et la culture in 2011. In 2015, he published a survey highlighting France's delay in using social media as an extension of the traditional contemporary art market.



DANIEL KAPELIAN

Artistic Director OMA Corée

Daniel Kapelian cultivates his selective creativity to initiate projects at the crossroads of disciplines and transversal forms. He operates a wide international network of resources, collaborators and partners.

Since he started partnering with OMA Space in 2018, he has opened new directions to explore, from craftsmanship to art and technology mixing primitive techniques with digital tools. In 2019, OMA Space won the Google Art Residency to produce the studio's first immersive installation at Mobilier National in Paris.



KLIO KRAJEWSKA

Curator and producer

Klio Krajewska – member of the WRO Art Center program team, curator specializing in the design, production and promotion of contemporary and digital art exhibitions and events. She regularly collaborates with WRO – Media Art Biennale in Poland where she organizes exhibitions, performances and conferences. Since 2018, Klio has been responsible for media arts development at the Watermans Arts Centre in London. She is vice-president of the Collectif MU based at La Station – Gare des Mines in Paris. Member of the Sur/Mesure collective for a curatorial residency at Mains d'Oeuvres in Paris.

Yvannoé Kruger is a curator and director of POUSH. From 2011 to 2015, he joined Jean de Loisy's artistic programming team at the Palais de Tokyo, where he organized a number of performances, festivals, concerts, and installations. He is frequently invited to participate in conferences and juries.

After the launch of artists' studios at the Orfèvrerie, he managed POUSH and offered exhibitions in situ and outside the walls such as at the Lambert Collection, the Vendôme Pavilion, and the Monnaie de Paris. As Artistic Director of Manifesto, he guides the reflections of programs and artistic commissions for projects.

In charge of the art section of Les Inrockuptibles, member of the editorial board of Spike Art Magazine and correspondent for Flash Art International, she is also pursuing a PhD in art and media theory at the University Paris 1 in co-direction with the University Paris 8, devoted to strategies of autonomy in the art of the years 2010.

His writings explore the ontological and epistemological transformations brought about by new technologies, as reflected in the mirror that artists tend to present-day.

Dominique Roland studied at the Ecole nationale supérieure des Beaux-Arts. For nearly twenty years, he has been head of the Centre des arts d'Enghien-les-Bains, a stage under the Digital Arts Convention of the Ministry of Culture. Since 2005, he has also directed the Biennale Internationale des arts numériques: Bains numériques.

In 2007, he founded the International Digital Arts Network (RAN), a platform that brings together 34 structures (theatres, museums, festivals, competitiveness cluster, universities, research laboratories).



BRICE ROY

Artistic Director & director of ICAN

Brice Roy is director of ICAN (Institute of Artistic and Numeric Creation). He is a digital artist and programmer, and heads ICAN's video game division. He's a player oriented designer and cultivates a fast prototyping culture. He has a degree in philosophy and is a teacher and researcher. He has a PhD in philosophy and works on the philosophy of video games.



JANINE SARBU

Director Metahaus

Passionate contemporary art collector, fashion designer, and businesswoman, Janine Sarbu is at the head of a holding company that she created in 1993. Its programming choices will revolve around the Book of Changes and the idea of transformation.

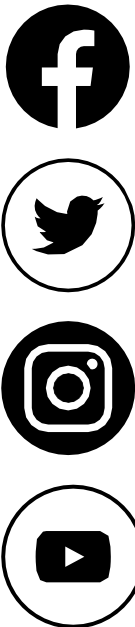
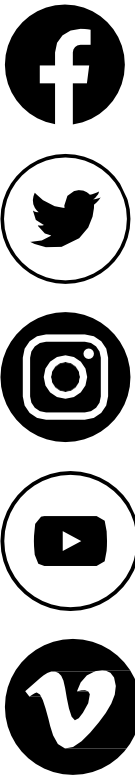
LES BAINS NUMÉRIQUES D'ENGHIEN



The Centre des arts d'Enghien-les-Bains is a centre for artistic creation, dissemination and residencies, recognised as a Scène conventionnée d'intérêt national "Art et création" by the French Ministry of Culture. CHATEAU SOUDARS



In the 1970s, Eric Mialhe began work on creating Château Soudars. He selected clay-limestone plots of high viticultural quality and undertook intensive work to prepare the soil and replant the majority of the vineyard.

In the 1980s, the vineyards reached maturity and produced a "classic" style of wine typical of the Haut-Médoc. Technical advances in the 80s contributed to this improvement in quality.

From 1995 onwards, Soudars enjoyed a favourable period, with several vintages of recognised quality on the market. Investments were made, notably in equipping the winery with temperature control systems and building a modern water treatment plant.

Every detail of the production process was carefully reviewed, from the choice of bottles to the quality of the corks.



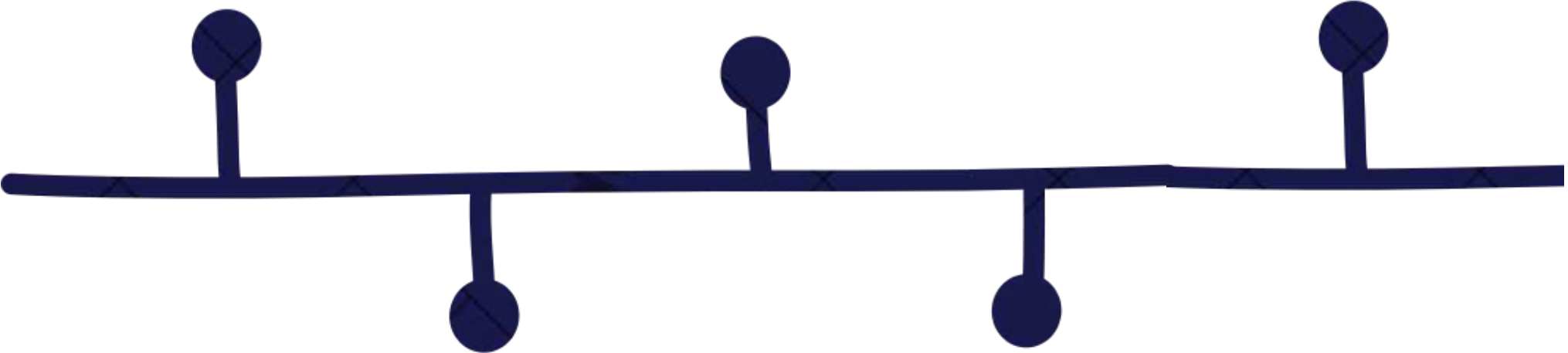

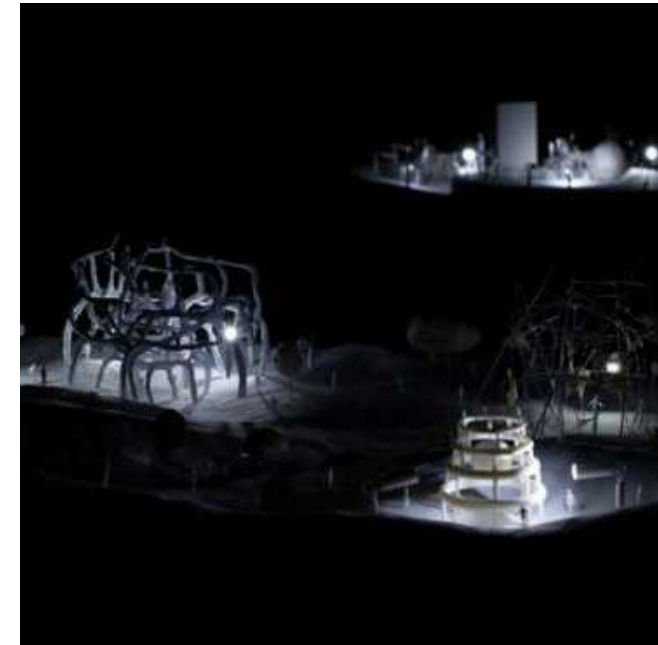
Public's Prize - VIDYA-KELIE

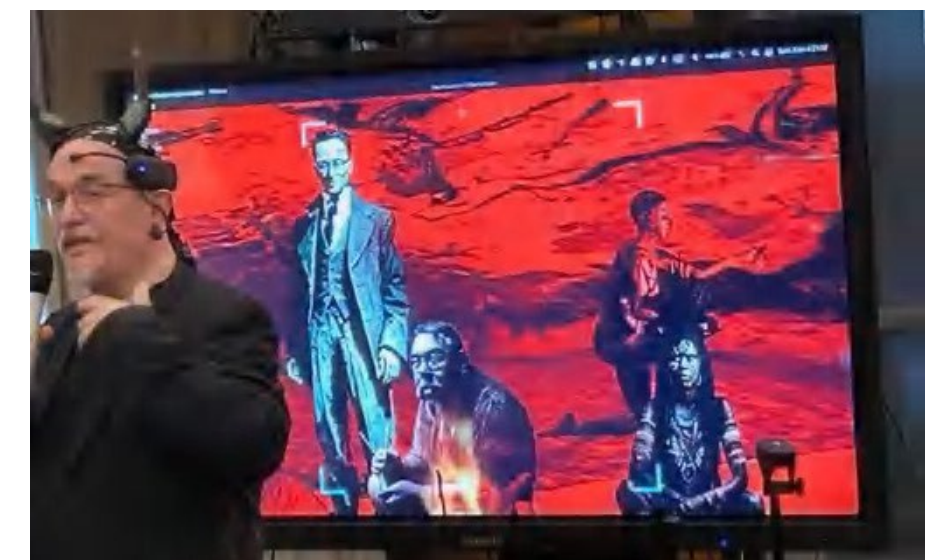
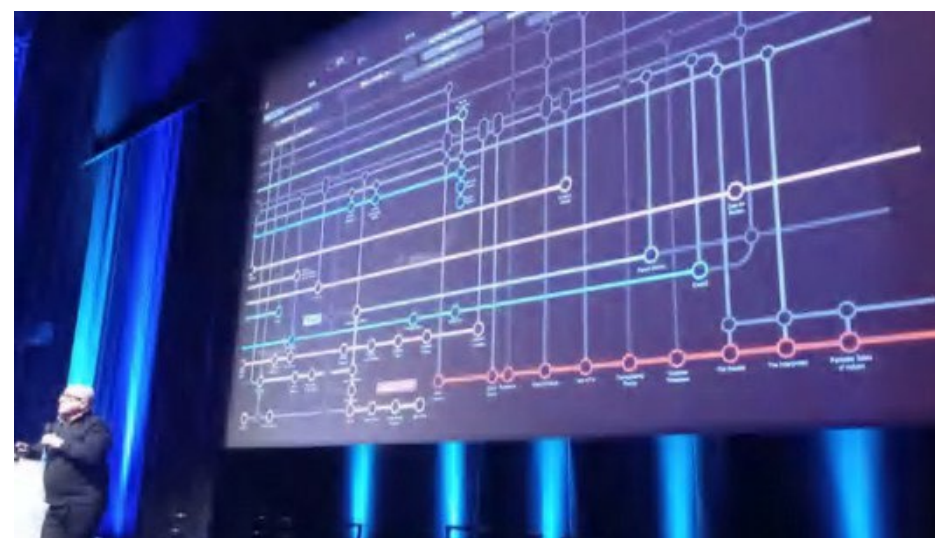
